1. Call to order – The regular meeting of KCHPC was called to order at 6:10 PM by Chairperson Roberts. A quorum was present.
2. Approval of agenda – Campbell moved to amend the agenda by adding an archeological monitoring report on the Murdock Building. Second by Barnett. Motion passed.
3. Opening remarks – Roberts welcomed the guests and thanked Laurie Simmons for the delicious cookies she had provided for the meeting.
4. Minutes – Courkamp moved to approve the minutes of the June meeting. Second by Barnett. Motion passed.
5. Reports –
  - a. Roberts reported that while on assignment in Washington, D.C. for the National Park Service, she met John Renaud, the National Park Service employee who is responsible for compiling all of the statistics gathered from the submitted CLG reports. Roberts reported that Colorado leads the nation in CLG reporting due mainly to the diligence of our own Dan Corson. Roberts was most pleased to receive this information and was eager to report the same to Dan upon her return. John and Sue Renaud, both NPS employees, were awarded the John and Susan Renaud Achievement Award by NAPC on July 20, 2012. This award was created in their honor as a tribute to their many years of service to NAPC as NPS employees and for the partnership that they have created between the organizations.
  - b. Roberts also reported on the lack of progress being made on financing for the Murdock Building renovation. Not for lack of trying, legislation is not moving forward. And, an archeological monitoring report on the Murdock Building has been submitted by architect, Belinda Zink.
  - c. Roberts reported that the CLG Annual Report had been submitted and accepted.
  - d. Simmons' of Front Range Research Associates, Inc. reported that they were in Kiowa County to begin the reconnaissance surveys on the seven properties for local, state and/or national nomination submission. Those properties are: Eads School Gym (Nat.); Eads Community Church (Nat.); Foster Lumber Company (Nat.) Hotel Holly in Haswell (Nat.); Jackson Barn (St.); Haswell Missouri-Pacific Depot (St.); Sheridan Lake School/Kiowa-Albright (St.). Unfortunately, permission has been removed on the Foster Lumber Company. Campbell will attempt to re-secure permission.

**MOTION:** Johnson moved that the Stavely Family in Haswell be contacted to secure permission to survey the only Lustron house in Colorado. If that attempt is unsuccessful, the round, brick home at 909 Maine Street in Eads will be next on the list. Second by Barnett. Motion passed.
